

London Contemporary Dance School – Student Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct supports the learning culture at London Contemporary Dance School to ensure all students can gain greatest benefit from their courses, and that all students and staff feel confident and comfortable in the building. The following information helps us all maintain a positive, healthy and professional working environment, and therefore all students are expected to:

Learning Culture

- Take responsibility to ensure that the time spent on the course is used to your full advantage.
- Recognise the value of approaching all your classes with curiosity and an open mind.
- Be aware of the need for reflection and independent study in taking responsibility for your own learning and development, and in order to see genuine progress.
- Consider the importance of learning to work independently as well as working collaboratively with your peers as part of a team.

Attendance and Reliability

- Take full advantage of the learning opportunities by attending all timetabled sessions, participating actively in classes and attending meetings and tutorials scheduled with tutors and supervisors.
- Understand the impact your engagement will have on being able to demonstrate your learning and your own personal growth.
- Be professional and considerate towards your peers and faculty regarding attendance.
 Consistent engagement will allow progress and students and staff will benefit from the collaborative nature of the courses.
- Be fully prepared both physically and mentally to start class promptly. Students who
 arrive to class more than 10 minutes late will be unable to participate in practical
 classes.
- Communicate openly with LCDS if you struggle with your attendance so that you can be supported.

Health and Safety

- Work mindfully in relation to safe practice, individual physical structure and learning styles:
- Ensure that clothing worn during practical classes is appropriate for the objectives of the session. As the requirements of particular sessions may vary (i.e. non marking trainers for Popping), communicate with teachers about what is expected.
- Be properly prepared and warmed-up for all practical sessions in order to maximise the effectiveness of the teaching.
- If you require support during your studies (including physical and / or mental health concerns, disability support etc) reach out to a member of staff as soon as possible to ensure you receive timely and appropriate support.

- To enable faculty to give successful feedback in practical classes ensure appropriate clothing is worn.
