Please note, only our full-time BA and MA degrees are eligible for Student Aid. Our professional development programmes; evening classes; short summer and Easter courses, and any other short courses are not credit bearing and are ineligible for any Federal Aid.

Students with loans or requesting prior loan deferment while enrolled at LCDS will have their loan details submitted to the NSLDS and this data will be accessible by guaranty agencies, lenders and schools determined to be authorised users of the data system.

Vaccinations policy

Whilst LCDS does not require students to be vaccinated it provides the following advice and guidance.

There has been a small increase in the rate of meningococcal meningitis or septicaemia in recent years. Young people attending higher education for the first time, especially when living in halls of residence or other shared accommodation, are at a greater risk of this disease particularly in the first few weeks of their first term at university. To achieve maximum protection students should consider immunisation against Meningitis C.

During the last few years an increase in cases of mumps among students has been noted; furthermore, there have been occurrences of measles in particular communities in the UK. These can be debilitating illnesses in young people with the possible risk of complications. UK Department of Health advice is that all those entering higher education should have had **TWO** immunisations against measles, mumps and rubella (known as MMR).

Textbook information

Mature Students

For U.S students to be eligible to receive federal financial assistance, they must possess a secondary school completion credential or its equivalent. Therefore, London Contemporary Dance School does not have the authority to obligate funds under the Direct Loan Programme for current or new US students who do not have a High School Diploma or equivalent qualification.

Third Party Debt Relief

Students and Alumni should be aware that some third party debt relief companies are misusing School and Department of Education logos and seals, attempting to give the impression that they are working with or on behalf of your School, and charging fees to help you manage your debt, in some cases without payments being made to reduce your balance. The Department of Education do not charge for debt relief or advice and students should contact their loan servicer for further advice regarding their repayment options, loan deferment or forebearance.
